




Succor Creek Natural Area

Duration: 3 days

Field trip is for paid members only. KEEP up with info. Weather and road conditions can affect this trip. Richard Ilg will lead trip on May 11- 13 for three days. You'll need to plan 2 travel days. Sign up at meeting 1st Thursday 6:30 children program and 7:00 pm for adults. Succor Creek State Natural Area lies in a deep, rocky canyon and is a remote haven for rock hounds and wildlife watchers. Limited souvenir collecting by rock hounds is permitted in the park. A rough 15 mile dirt road leads from Oregon 201 to the park, which has primitive camping and day-use areas along both side of the creek. No water is available. The Succor Creek Bridge is open to vehicles for access to the campsites on the east side of the creek (right/south of the bridge). The road to the left/north of the bridge is not safe for vehicular travel. Most will camp the night before the field trip will start at 8 am Thursday. There are no pay phones or cell phone services at the Park. Staff and Staff Volunteers are not stationed at this site. This is a remote recreational experience, please prepare accordingly. Year-round camping (first-come, first-served) Four primitive sites on the west side of the creek; 14 primitive campsites on the east side of the creek . Vault toilet: No water available.

Cost: \$1.50 per pound, (club min 20 1bs)

Meet at site anytime during the day, dig for petrified wood. They also have a bone pile that you can pick through and not get dirty.

Amenities: water for cleaning rocks, bathroom, wagons, some tools

Gear needed: rock hammer (or hammer and chisel), shovels, buckets for carrying gear and rock washing water. Drinking water, sunscreen, cash, spray bottle and a sack lunch or snack. Rain boots, or a change of foot wear. It can be very muddy this timeof the year.
