Next, I want to talk about the club positions open that we need to fill before we swear-in our officers in December. If you've been curious about helping monthly at the meetings and being and officer or chairperson, please review the open positions below. If you are interested in any of the positions, please talk to the current person at the meeting, and they can answer your questions. Descriptions are pulled from our bylaws and procedures.

SUNSHINE (Chairperson)

- Send cards to members whose families have medical needs or who have experienced a recent death in the family.
- Maintain an awareness of the health, well-being, and status of club members.
- Contact members who have become ill or otherwise unable to attend meetings and perhaps need assistance from other club members.
- Get cards to be sent as needed, and update members at club meetings when appropriate.

SECRETARY (Officer)

Duties described in the By-Laws the Secretary and any additional are described below:

- The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Directors and be available to the Society.
- The Secretary with the President shall sign all vouchers, written contracts, and obligations of the Society.
- Secretary shall keep a complete record of minutes of all meetings for a period of 5 years. This needs to be kept electronically if possible.
- Forward meeting minutes to newsletter editor before due date.
- Correspond with other parties as directed by the President or Board Chairperson.
- Picks up club mail at the PO Box and brings it to meetings.

MEMBERS AT LARGE (Officer) we need 2-3

- The Members at Large shall be the liaison officers between the Members of the Society and the Board of Directors.
- May be used by the President on various Society Committees.
- Present a slate of nominations for WAMS officers at the regular October meeting.
- Serve on the audit committee and review club financials in January.
- Meet and greet visitors and new members at club meetings.
- Work with members who may have questions or issues they are concerned about.

SHOW CHAIR (Board position) this could be co-chaired.

The Show chairperson's job is to delegate responsibility and then provide the atmosphere of leadership to develop incentive, personal ingenuity and imagination for club members to get the job done.

• Select a Show Committee and have an organizational meeting(s). Conduct all Show Committee meetings. Establish and maintain good communication with all Show Committee Chairs.

- In charge of preparing a realistic budget and working within the budget.
- See that good records are kept and maintained for future Show Chairperson.
- Make a presentation at your club at meetings. Keep them appraised of the progress.
- Keep the Board of Directors informed about the show planning and all major decisions that may need a vote.
- Responsible for obtaining key to site and returning key. Responsible for opening and locking up site.

HOSTESS (CHAIRPERSON)

The Hostess chairpersons' job is to greet and welcome members as they arrive, provide raffle tickets for sale and door prize tickets, provide a sign-up sheet for logging members attendance, sign-up sheet for name tags, and other misc club pamphlets, upcoming shows and informational brochures.

September 2023 Field Trip: Hampton Butte Calling all Hampton Butte enthusiasts 09/15-09/17



Save the dates above and get ready for one of the favorite localities among petrified wood enthusiasts. This was the first dig site that got me back in touch with rockhounding after a long layoff. Hampton Butte is widely known for the unusual green petrified wood that can be found there. In addition, red, yellow, and other unusual colors can be found at this site. There is some material on the ground surface, but fine specimens are still available to rockhounds willing to dig. For anyone new to this area; it is dry camping you want to make sure you have a good supply of water; plenty of fuel, and camping gear. We will have juniper trees around us with some shade. Day 2, we will take a trip to the north side where last year we found 3-4 petrified tree trunks. Stay near others as these hillsides can get you turned around in a hurry; I have done it myself. We will have a signup at the September 7th meeting .



Meet at the Brothers Rest Area on Highway 20 (MP 42.8) east of Bend @8:00 am or at the site @9:00 am. Bring lunch, water and your field gear. Be prepared for hot or cold high desert fall weather. You will also need a long handle shovel and short tine rake. We will fill and level earlier digs. The ground is soft and the holes are less than 24" deep.

<u>Directions from Brothers Rest Area</u> – Take Highway 20 east to Van Lake Road. Turn north and follow Van Lake Road 10.5 - 11 miles to SE Price/Twelve Mile Road and turn right. Follow Price Road about 2 miles to the site. It is 22 miles one way from the Brothers Rest Area to Hampton Butte.
